

DIRECTIONS TO NORTHPORT

The Birches
107 E. 4th Street.
Northport, Michigan

Drive time from Traverse City is about 40 mins. From the western edge of Traverse City, follow M-22 north along the west side of the bay. Keep the water on your right, and you will be all set!

Continue north on M-22 through Sutton's Bay, passing through Peshawbetown (Tribal community) and Leelanau Sands Casino and Show Room. Continue through Omena, where you are right along the bay, and the road bends through the tiny village. Note Leelanau Cellars and Knot Just a Bar!

Watch for a pretty sign on your right (flowers, carved/painted sign) marking the entry to Northport. After the sign, but just before you enter Northport, M-22 breaks left to Leland.

DON'T take this turn, but continue straight into the Village of Northport. The road you are on becomes Route M-201.

Follow M-201 as it jogs (right, left, right, left) through town (via Waukazoo and Nagonaba, noting Stubb's Grill on the right. When you are right in the town, see Tom's Market on your right, and at that corner go left onto Mill. (It feels like you are just continuing on the same road as it jogs through town, and you don't even have stop signs at the left turn onto Mill.)

Going north along Mill Street (passing Barb's Bakery on the right and The Eat Spot on the left) you'll see the numbered cross streets intersecting as you go -- come along three blocks to 4th Street, turn right.

107 is about half way down the block on the left. There's a paved circular drive. You will recognize the house from the web site pictures.

Ordinarily, the house will be standing open in expectation of your arrival. During the summer we are at 115 E. 4th, so you can also look for assistance there. Our phone at 115 is 231-386-7481.

The phone in the house is local service only. The phone number is 231-386-5254. Please note, there is no long distance service or voicemail on this line. If messages are important to you when visiting us, please bring a portable answering machine. Long distance calls should be made using a calling card. Do not assume your cell phone will be truly functional in Northport. Though towers are under construction, the nearest is some distance away, and service can be erratic.
